2.14 Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC

Monitoring the quality aspects related to all academic and administrative activities of the college

- **Circle meeting:** As a part of TQM concepts implementation IQAC started conducting Circle meetings from 28/12/2015. The circle meeting is held for about 10 - 15 minutes every day as per a fixed agenda. The Principal, IQAC member secretary, all academic department HOD's and nonacademic department Managers identify, analyze and solve work-related problems and present their solutions to management in order to improve the performance of the Institution, and motivate and enrich the working atmosphere. IQAC records the minutes of the circle meeting everyday in a structured format. This circle meeting concept boosted a positive attitude and creates a tension-free atmosphere, which each individual faculty likes, understands, and co-operates with other in the decision making processes of the services offered in our Institution.

Co-ordination of synchronous functioning of various committees of the college.

- IQAC governs various committees and monitors the functioning of the committees constituted in our Institution.
- IQAC conducts periodical meetings with these committees where the academic plan of each committee is discussed and the documents pertaining to various activities of the committees are recorded and reviewed.
- **The Institutional board of studies (IBS)** is the principal body monitoring the development programs of the Institution. The IBS conducted annual meeting on 22/1/2016 and discussed the planning of new courses/ programs, Academic Calendar, Master Timetable, extension activities to enhance teaching and learning resources.
- **Institutional Review Board (IRB) & Ethics Committee** monitors the research activities periodically to improve the competency of students and staff in research methodology. The committee conducted a research program on external funding with an eminent speaker DR CKK NAIR on 29/2/2016 with the support of SAF.
- **Anti-Ragging committee** to monitor and control, the menace of ragging. The committee conducted a guest lecturer on 19/10/2015 with an external speaker Dr Lakshmi Ravi who spoke about the ill effects & legal consequences of ragging to the I BDS students.
- **The Academic Cell** is responsible for preparing the yearly academic calendar for faculty, Non teaching staff and students by the month of August. The cell also records the attendance of the students & monitors the student's progression by analysing the results of the student's examination. The results of the terminal exams conducted at the end of each term are informed to the parents.
- **Scientific Academic Forum (SAF)** conducts the Clinical Society Meeting every month which is a platform for sharing of knowledge among Students and Staff. The interesting cases, recent advances and various related techniques are discussed with a PowerPoint presentation and by displaying photographs and videos. All the Faculties from each department including CRRIs and MDS Students are eligible to present the Paper in this Inter Departmental Meeting. Other activities conducted are Guest lectures, Webinars, CDE programs & workshops with coordination from the respective head of the departments.
- **The Student Welfare committee (SWC)** forms student council through election and monitors the co-curricular and extracurricular activities of the students. SWC organized Annual day celebration of our Institution on 23/4/2016. Faculties & Students were awarded for their academic achievements of the previous academic year 2014-15.

- **Mentor Program & Parents teacher association** - The mentor committee takes care of the academic performance and monitors the students 'progression. In addition, the mentors in the committee provide personal counselling to the students and communicate with their parents if and when needed. On 11/4/2016 the committee conducted parent teacher meeting for this year. 195 parents attended the meeting and 163 feedbacks were collected and analysed. Suggestions which were justifying were submitted to the management for consideration.
- **Facility management and safety measures** – the committee organized a fire drill program for the staff and the students on 8/6/2016. It by conducted by Mr Muthupandian from safex fire service limited. This program created awareness on the emergency measures and preparedness in case of a fire accident. A mock drill was conducted in which volunteers from faculty, nonteaching staff and students participated.
- **Alumni committee** -The committee organized an Alumni meet on 23/4/2016. The Alumni association APDCH "Rewind 2016" conducted a program with chief Guest Mrs. Bharathi Baskaran, Tamil orator and momentos were presented to the Alumni who attended the meeting.

Organization of CDE program on quality related themes to achieve 40 CDE points from DCI / The Tamilnadu Dr.MGR Medical University.

- IQAC along with SAF organize and documents various CDE programs leading to quality improvement. The Institution also recognizes its responsibility to provide the dental professional with high-quality CDE covering the most current information available on a wide variety of topics, from new techniques and materials to innovative practice management solutions. Total 15 state level CDE programs/ webinars /workshops / clinical society meetings were organized.

Analysis of the feedback response obtained from the students, parents and faculty on quality related institutional processes IQAC obtains the feedback from various stakeholders such as students, faculty, parents and alumni. The feedbacks are analyzed and benchmarks are set for quality improvement.

Release of Institutional Newsletter.

- On 23/4/2016 the Institutional newsletter for the academic year 2015 -16 was released by the Patron Sakthi Thirumathi Lakshmi Ammal. This Newsletter was circulated to various colleges in South India facilitating dissemination of information pertaining to the developments and activities of the Institution.

Soft skill training for students

- IQAC conducts Soft skills training program which will make the students aware of his / her hidden capabilities and to refine it for the overall development and success of the student. Soft Skills training programs fine-tune the students' attitudes, values, beliefs, motivation, desires, feelings, eagerness to learn, willingness to share and embrace new ideas, goal orientation, flexibility, persuasion, futuristic thinking, diplomacy, and various skill sets of communication, manners, and etiquette so that they will be able to deal with different situations diligently and responsibly.
- Total of 70 hours training was done in the form of weekly classes for the IBDS students with external expertise -Mr Dwaraknath, Ms Lavanya, Dr Vaithegi MD General Pathologist, MS Asha Daniel. The topics covered were Goal setting, time management, team building, life skills, self discipline, 5S housekeeping and leadership. Activity included in the training program were mind mapping, group discussions, role plays and quizzes. Pathanjali Yoga centre conducted regular Yoga classes for the IBDS students.

- IQAC conducted 4 internal audits (once every 3 month) and 1 external audit with BSI group (22/3/2016) for the academic year 2015 -16 and analyzed the academic activities of the departments on a regular basis to provide suggestions on areas of improvement for the individual departments. The audit reports were reviewed in management review meeting (MRM) on 14/3/2016 (once in six months) with the top management.

- School dental health services

- Among the 10 adopted villages, screening and dental treatment was done for 5 villages.
- Observation of important days significant to oral health - the institution arranges competitions, rallies, awareness programs and health campaigns consistent with special occasions like Anti-tobacco day, National Tooth Brushing day, Oral Hygiene day, Dentist day, Oral surgery day.
- On 7/3/16 'An awareness skit' was performed by the students near the outpatient department at our college premises to imply the importance of dental checkups and dental health.
- For World Health day celebration, Hepatitis B vaccination programme was organized for all the staff & students on 4/4/16. 272 members were vaccinated in commemoration of this juncture.
- On 12/4/16 Oral Cancer Screening camp was conducted at Madhuranthagam, many cases of premalignant lesions were identified and preliminary investigations were done. Awareness program was conducted to the participants by the NSS unit of our college.
- Faculty members from various departments participate on a regular basis in all the community health awareness programs such as tobacco cessation, anti-cancer awareness, anti-HIV campaign and regular dental awareness and treatment camps.
- The Institute has two Satellite Health Centre's at Madhuranthagam and Venmalnagaram which caters to the basic oral health needs of the local population.
- The Institution has NSS wing and is a part of NSS unit of university, through which oral health services are provided to the underserved population.

Best practices ii:

Title: Implementation of TQM practices

Objective:

To implement TQM practices such as circle meeting, 5S housekeeping and Kaizen as continuous improvement in our Institution

The context:

Total Quality Management (TQM) practice is an approach of implementation which focuses on quality along with the participation of everyone (including Faculties, nonteaching staff) in the organization. The implementation strategies include planning, mobilization, capacity building, monitoring and evaluation. The TQM implementation approach focuses more on performance than on promises.

Institutionalization of best practices:

Institutionalization is the process of making the best practices an integral part of the institutional working. Firstly, these 3 TQM practices such as circle meeting, 5S and kaizen are our institution-specific. Secondly, these TQM practices seem to require extra effort for its success.

1.Circle meeting- The circle meeting concept boosted a positive attitude and creates a tension-free atmosphere, which each individual faculty likes, understands, and co-operates with other in the decision making processes of the services offered in our Institution.

IQAC Conduct circle meetings for 15 minutes every day with the Principal, IQAC member secretary, all academic department HODs' and nonacademic department Mangers to identify, analyze and solve work-related problems and present their solutions to management in order to improve the performance of the Institution, and motivate and enrich the work of the faculty. IQAC records the minutes of the circle meeting everyday in a structured format.

2.5S housekeeping - The 5-S practice is a technique used to establish and maintain quality environment in an organisation. The name stands for five Japanese words: Seiri, Seiton, Seiso, Seiketsu and Shitsuke. *Seiri* is sorting through the contents of the workplace and removing unnecessary items. This is an action to identify and eliminate all unnecessary items from the workplace. *Seiton* is putting the necessary items in their place and providing easy access. This is an action to put every necessary item in good order, and focuses on efficient and effective storage methods. *Seiso* involves cleaning everything, keeping it clean daily, and using cleaning to inspect the workplace and equipment for defects. This is an action to clean the workplace daily. *Seiketsu* involves creating visual controls and guidelines for keeping the workplace organized, orderly and clean. This is a condition where a high standard of good housekeeping is maintained. *Shitsuke* involves training and discipline to ensure that everyone follows

the 5S standards. This is a condition where all members practice the first four S's spontaneously and willingly as a way of life. Accordingly, it becomes the culture in the organization.

IQAC conducts monthly 5S audit to monitor the TQM Practices and documents the data separately. A team of 5 members including Principal, IQAC member secretary, 2 Administrative office, and Nursing matron inspects all department of the Institution (Academic and non-academic). Detailed scoring done separately for each department with overall observations, capturing photographs before and after the implementation and assess the difference and the report is reviewed by the management. The main benefits of implementing 5S are the productivity of the Institution improves together with the quality of services. IQAC have introduced annual 5S awards where efforts of each department are recognized and rewarded. It involves identifying benchmarks of excellent practices and instilling a sense of ownership of the process

3. Kaizen - Kaizen means "continuous improvement of processes and functions of an Institution through change". All faculties irrespective of his/her designation or level in the hierarchy need to contribute by incorporating small improvements and changes in the system. IQAC collects every month report from all the faculties in a structured format. The best kaizen are analyzed by the IQAC coordinator along with the management. The best kaizen are also rewarded once in 3 months in circle meeting by the correspondent.

Evidence of success:

Change for the better, TQM practices will facilitate a heightened level of clarity and focus in institutional functioning towards quality enhancement and assist internalization of the quality culture. Hence these 3 TQM practices implemented in our Institution contribute to the enhancement and integration among the faculties and also provide a sound basis for decision-making to improve institutional functioning.

Challenges encountered:

Participation by all faculties in the implementation of TQM practices is critical in gaining high-level commitment to the Institution's quality culture.

Conclusion:

Quality upgradation is not a onetime phenomenon. Quest for excellence is a continuous and perennial pursuit. IQAC plays a vital role to internalize and institutionalize quality benchmarking. The TQM practices act as triggering agent of 'Quality Culture' among the Institution, as well as enhancing the awareness of Institutional Quality Assurance with all stakeholders.
